# Member Reports:

### Director

Ongoing meetings on the 2015 budget (below Finance report) and calendar.

Calendar Group (CG) has completed final draft of 2015 Calendar (edits still happening). Alice is working on the budget spreadsheet to see how well it meets our revenue needs. We tried to offer less classes in response to teacher concerns. All this means possible further revisions. please review in the events spreadsheet:

Membership - have sent thank you's re: all donations and increase in dues (continue to come in) received as a result of our Sept HoP appeal letter to our Members and community. As of 10/21 we have received approx \$2300 in donations and dues increases. Dues increases will also positively affect our income stream for 2015.

Membership is working on a town hall type gathering, now on our Calendar for Jan 31 (please plan to attend everyone). This will include the aspiration contemplation SI suggests, info on dues and UG, and some kind of dialogue between Council/community around goals, desires, strategic planning etc. Corey and I will be coming to Council to work on this and we are in concert with David and the team.

Meditation Marathon - revenue lower than last year, still being collected, projected at approx \$2200, attendance increased about 20%. This is still a great event for us, nice opportunity for gathering to practice in support of Center, and it helps to get the word out about what we do. Need to look at dates for next year and will Kim and Chris pass the baton? If so should recruit someone to lead this sooner than later.

Rent will increase to \$2150 per month in 2015. This would be a good moment for any negotiation; anyone have requests to explore with our landlord going into 2015? Storage is on my mind, not sure we can find any more but it is needed.

Theft/security - forwarded Abbey's email re: recent theft (MP recorder, \$200 to replace); and identified suspect. Action from Kasung?

Working with Abbey to develop Volunteer program, she has drafted a letter, guidelines she wants to send out. I'm encouraging her to set up some in person meetings to discuss.

Met with members of Publicity Team, discussed creating style guidelines, identified copy editors and "on call" pool; agreed Pub team will create a budget and master plan for publicity needs/goals for 2015 by end of 2014.

Collaboration opportunity, Holocek program - met with Ann Cason (who is spearheading this) and two members of Tergar community. Lot of enthusiasm to co-host a program with Andrew

Holocek on Preparing to Die. His programs have had huge success in other locations, recently at the Sh Center in Santa Rosa. Proposal to split costs, hosting and staffing; hold in late 2015 or early 2016 at offsite location (rent or free space) to accomodate 50 + participants. Host a one day program for health care providers, public? Plus weekend for more Buddhist program though still geared to public. This would mean Center making a commitment of approx \$1500 - 2500. for our portion of shared costs, depending on venue etc. More info on Andrew: <a href="http://www.andrewholecek.com/category/teachings-blog/">http://www.andrewholecek.com/category/teachings-blog/</a>

Enviro - the Enviro work group plan: create a floating table top with storage underneath in the hallway underneath the thangka; this will still have space for ikebana and display of the thangka. Then move all folding tables out of Annex to there, and find safe storage for the throne cushion to move to. This will 'clean out' the Annex so can move lending library to Annex, and expand bookstore into empty shelves. That will let us remove the table in the tea area that is being used for the bookstore and replace it with a desk/area for the Kasung.

## Finance (Lisa at present)

We need to discuss strategies going forward to recruit a Finance Director, or what to do in light of not having anyone qualified. We are asking Alice to do work which she isn't 100% happy to offer, and it is drawing on my time and resources as well.

Met with Alice to work on 2015 budget. She is out of town at present but will send to Council the final draft for review by Nov 23 so that we can discuss any additions/changes in our Dec meeting and retreat.

Alice is projecting that we will have another overage this year - our class #s are up, dues and # of members are increasing steadily. This has offset lower #s from our Fall fundraising campaigns (HoP and MM), and the cancellation of classes in 2014. While a good 'problem' to have I'd like to move towards less conservative projections of revenue - better to budget for what we really need during the year, based on trends, than to have lump sums to spend at year's end.

Alice and I discussed revising the Class Budget spreadsheet to capture data on #s and % use of GP, Patron price so it is captured in a master sheet. This data is vital to building our annual budget each year and we can only see it now by reviewing each individual class report. If she is able to offer this it will be a tremendous support.

Michaela and I finished first draft of Class budget spreadsheet but it needs revision of #s to get us closer to better projections for 2015 budget (see report above).

### Overview & current issues

- The project to integrate the SDB and Mailchimp email lists is progressing. We are scheduled to "go live" on Monday November 17. The integration will reduce busy-work that Abbey has been charged with and will improve the quality of our data. This involves writing directly to people who have discrepant Mailchimp Accounts, who appear on one side but not on another, etc. As a result of merging the lists, sending a message to the Portland Newsletter list now goes to 1,383 people rather than the 626 people that were included before.

  - Verifying that the teacher bios are current, included in <u>the tab of the Events</u>
     <u>Spreadsheet</u>, and show on the appropriate program pages
  - Getting a photo from the teacher, posting it on WordPress, and linking to it from a program page.
- David Engelbrecht is cross-checking program pages in the SDB, groups and projects pages on the website, and the contact form information so that all three are synchronized and consistent.
- Met with Lisa, Abbey, Laura Byrd and Jason on flyer production. Following up with Laura and Jason shortly.
