- Review David Engelbrecht's Proposal
 - Our membership coordinator, David Engelbrecht, submitted a proposal to start a Social Outreach Group in our center. This would be a group that would give room for community members to pursue their own projects and ideas related to social outreach, connect together and share energy and interests.
 - Discussion was had about the group, what it might do, where it fits within our current organizational structure and how it could be set up so that it doesn't need to move all its actions through Council or another Governance body.
 - The Council invited David to attend the next meeting in May to discuss the proposal further.
- First Quarter Financial Report First Quarter Budget vs Actual
 - Jack Bodner presented our 1Q financial report. Some interesting notes- our attendance was higher than projected for programs, while our overall income was slightly lower than projected. The overall income per person for WOS seems to be lower than projected, which indicates a higher reliance on the Generosity Policy than expected.
 - The Council discussed several specific items of the report, noting a few classes that did exceptionally well, such as the writing workshop held by Bill Scheffle.
- Proposal to study the calendaring process.
 - John David Smith proposed to convene a subcommittee to study our calendaring process, comparing it with the way that others center handle this process. This process has been a significant drain on the time of those involved in it, as it is very intensive, and he proposes doing this as a way of potentially reducing that workload, as well as increasing collaboration between other nearby centers like Seattle.
- Discussion on Public Notes, Blog Posts
 - A discussion was had on the best methods for disseminating information to the
 Center Members about Council Meetings, with the desire to maintain or increase

transparency while still being conscious of what needs and what does not need to be shared.

We are also continuing to work on our process; we will hold monthly meetings as needed to discuss Calendar needs, edits, proposals etc. We hope this will help us to plan ahead, be more proactive and less reactive and to be able to communicate timeframes to those needing info or making proposals.

Key Bank transition to new signatories completed, Jack now has access as our Chagdzo.

Worked with Corey on the agenda/schedule with input from Council, and facilitation for our Council Retreat 3/29/15, hosted by Bettina.

Met with David Engelbrecht to discuss the proposal for creating a Social Outreach group at the Center to begin this Fall 2015 (see link above). If approved I will co-host the initial meeting and support David throughout the process.

Helped with the planning for the Parinirvana Celebration; about 25 in attendance. We had a nice Feast, stories and practiced the Sadhana of Mahamudra together.

Council Arts Seat sub-committee worked on communications to the Arts Council regarding process and questions from the Council in order to move forward to next step. Arts Council is discussing, we are awaiting a response.

Finance & Chagdzo



Facebook

I'm continuing the effort to integrate all of the different channels that the Shambhala Center uses to communicate with the public. Here are <u>some preliminary results</u>. One highlight is the following box plot which compares reach by type of post (reach is how many people would have seen something that we post). "Status" messages have a greater reach by far than any other type of posting. (In a box plot half of the observations are inside the box and a quarter each are above and below the box, so the plot shows that few photos or links reach as many people as any of our "Status" messages.)



The box plot is shown on a log scale, so 1 represents 10, 2 represents 100, and 3 represents 1,000. With this difference in the readership of the different "Types", here's an experimental and topical status message:

Shhh! The Portland Shambhala Center is closed all week, except for the diligent meditators participating in our Spring Weekthun: Lojong and the Practice of Enlightened Society. More than 20 people are exploring the Lojong slogans, a revered and time-tested collection teachings from the Mahayana tradition of Buddhism. These

slogans help us extend love towards ourselves and compassion towards others, both essential elements of creating enlightened society. If you aren't one of the 20, you could look them up on Wikipedia or in Pema's "Start where you are" book and meditate as much as you can!

Ashe Mahamudra Retreat: April 24-26, 15 registered.

Shambhala Training Level I: May 15-16, 8 registered.

The Road Home: Talk and Book Signing with Shastri Ethan Nichtern: May 17, 13 registered.

Rigden: Unconditional Confidence: May 29-31, 13 registered.

Queer Dharma (Jason & Michaela):

Approximately 15 people in attendance for Michaela's talk titled "Grace in Defeat." More than \$30 left in donation. Lots of interest in upcoming programs - specifically Ethan Nichtern's visit.

Family Council (Mark Douglass):

I will have a conversation with Kim McCoy on 4/19 regarding possible transition of leadership for Family Council.

Relational Meeting/Listening Team (Mark Douglass):

We have eight people confirmed as participants on the team so far. Conversations with 3-5 more to round out the group.

Young Meditators (Corey):

Young Meditators met on March 26th and April 9th.

On March 26th, Stephen Jensen facilitated his first meeting for the group, leading discussion on a reading from a book by John Kabat-Zinn. Attendance was good, and it was a lively discussion.

On April 9th, a "Sparks" meeting was held to generate more ideas for meetings for the group. Attendance was light, which we think was partially due to an unexpected sunny day, and partially due to talking 'about the group' not being a very accessible or interesting topic for newcomers. It turned into a more informal discussion about how such brainstorming should be done, with a decision to try out having more guided discussions about ideas happen on a regular, possibly monthly basis after a meeting. Some ideas for summer meetings were generated- BBQs, picnics, campouts.

Heart of Recovery (Ruth): Big changes! All of our online and publicity material has been rewritten. The mission and purpose have been clarified and refined. Exciting spring energy! Beginning in May, we'll be offering 2 session per month and discussions will focus on *Start Where You Are* for the next several months. Gardner Murphy will be assisting with leading Tonglen. He's been a leader in our group in many ways, but has had a relaxed approach to it. AJ is currently taking some time away from facilitating to take care of personal issues. Keep her in your heart and tonglen practices. When she's ready, we're glad to have her back.

Diversity (Michaela):

On March 31, Michaela spoke on the phone with Jane Arthur who is the member of Shambhala International's Kalapa Council who oversees the land centers. Jane solicited Michaela's ideas on educating land center staff about transgender issues toward helping them accommodate the needs of transgender people with regard to name and pronoun use, registration form categories, dormitory and bathroom/shower assignments, etc. Michaela sent her Michaela's essay on "Gender Identity in Shambhala" that was published in the December issue of the *Shambhala Times*, as well as the booklet on accommodating transgender people at meditation and retreat centers that was produced by a group of transbuddhists in New York. Jane will schedule a phone conference with land center staff and Michaela when Michaela can talk with them all about these issues.

Aging, Death & Dying (Ann):

Ray Sten and I met with Diane McQueen and Jean Ellen Hertzog about the Andrew Holecek conference in October. We are still looking for the right venue and should have something by end of week. Also, I turned in a request for a class to prepare for the Graceful Exits week-end. We will call it Preparing to Die based on Andrew Holecek's book of the same name. We will advertise the class with publicity for the program. The proposal is for 5 Monday nights in August, 7 to 9 pm at the center. We suggested \$50 price, but Micheala told us it should be 98 or 115 depending whether it is 4 or 5 nights. That is fine with generosity policy. I am thinking we might offer people taking the week-end a package deal and also let people into the class who aren't taking the week-end. I am not sure about this.

Ray Sten has agreed to coordinate and Nancy Smith also has come on board.

Nancy Smith and Christine Siemes are also coordinating the Portland Aging Mandala's next meeting which will be at Nancy's house on May 16th,
