## Agenda Items- High Priority

Items that need to be accomplished this meeting.

- Council Fundraising Duties
  - The center is coming into its fundraising season, where traditionally we need to raise money to balance the budget and meet the needs of the center. The Council made a commitment towards helping fundraise as part of taking a leap in last years budgeting process and budgeting for more than what was projected to be raised.
  - Decisions:
    - Broad agreement from those present to help with HoP for fundraising.
  - Action Items:
    - JB: Contacting missing Council Members to ask if they could help make calls.
- Discussion of Jane Arthur Call, next steps
  - The Council had a short discussion around a call that was had between Council and Jane Arthur, Kalapa Envoy for Leadership and Training, on a new process for re-appointing Center Directors. Our Center Director, Lisa Stanley's, tenure ends on Shambhala Day of 2016, and we are working on the process to review and make a decision on her re-appointment, if she seeks another term.
- Follow up on "Extending Council greetings to participants at the end of a program".
   Jason and John met to refine a proposal
  - A proposal was brought in previously from Council members on having a Council Member "Rota" for attendance at events to speak to attendees about the center and Shambhala.
  - Decisions:
    - **Table** until we get more feedback from teachers, review after feedback from this meeting is incorporated.
  - Action Items:
    - Send to the Teachers to get feedback.

- Prep for Communications on Sunday
  - The Council prepared for work engaging with applied communications for the Council Retreat. This is part of the Council's ongoing work on team building, communications, and instilling a culture of kindness into the leadership that we hope will outlive the particular members of this Council, and spread out into the greater community. This work came from challenges the Council had faced in their history with effective and kind communication.
- Should we reschedule the September Council Meeting?
  - Currently 2 days before HoP
  - Decisions:
    - No.

## **Agenda Items- Moderate Priority**

Items that need to be accomplished soon, preferably this meeting.

- Proposal for the formation of a Nyida Day Planning Committee
  - Jason, our Societal Health and Well Being representative, brought in proposal to create a committee which would help plan the Nyida Days, our Shambhala Holidays. We have had challenges with who holds these days, and doing planning in advance enough that we can get a bigger picture, and not asking from the same volunteers.
  - o Issues:
    - As part of bringing this in, asking people to consider their ability to join or who they could suggest to fill a seat in their place.
    - Main obstacle has been not having a coordinator in a timely manner.
    - Reflecting the importance of Nyida Days. Could sort of be a standing committee that meets 6 to 8 weeks prior to the event to take care of all of the details.
  - Decisions:
    - Broad Agreement Approval
  - Action Items:
    - Jason: Send as a request, considering your personal involvement, and propose either yourself or another as a representative in the next 4-6 weeks.
- Proposal for meetup.com account
  - The Council discussed funding a Meetup.com account for the affinity groups of the Center. Discussion around what is the best way of doing this (one Center account vs. multiple accounts for the different groups), where this fits into our budgeting and budget process, and the benefits of this expense.
  - Decisions:
    - **Tabled.** Jason will bring it back in after more research.
  - Action Items:

Jason will check in with Meetup again on having a Center account, and cost for adding more than 3. Is there a minimum time you have to commit?

#### Unresolved Issues:

- Confusion around Communications budget. How much is there? What can it be used for? What is left currently? What comes out of it and when?
- Discrepancy between communications budget approved vs. Communications budget in spreadsheet?
- Publicity budget for next year- Looking into what programs we should do banner ads for, investing more into this.
- Spending the Overage money midyear, or before the end of the year?

## **Member Reports:**

Director

**Outreach** - We completed our 3rd Annual Life.Art. Being Festival and collaboration with BeSpace. Attendance was fair to good at Center events. Waiting for class report from Abbey to determine revenue. We are discussing bringing Lee Worley from Naropa next year as the keynote; possible Maitri Space program if fits.

Ongoing work on the Tergar/Shambhala collaborative program "Graceful Exits". We have a beautiful card and publicity which was professionally done yet affordable. The page is up on our website and registration is open.

We participated in the 24 Hour Interfaith Practice at the Great Vow Monastery. Timaree led a session which included the Basic Goodness reminders. Walker Blaine and David Brown advised her on the choice of chants to offer for this setting.

Myself and members of the Arts Council - Abbey and Deborah - met with the Director of Tours and a few of the docents at the Portland Art Museum to talk about their meditation tours. They gave us a tour and we offered feedback about it, as well as information about dharma art. It did not feel there was a further connection there for us but it was a good meeting and gave us visibility at PAM.

**Council Seats** - We have a new Rusung, Dan Rubin! Dan expressed keen interest in the role, and within a few days Regional Commander Jai Crapella approved the appointment. Auspiciously we had a Kasung Officer in town, Dr. Michael Gayner, who was able to give the Oath. Please welcome Rusung Rubin!

Michaela and I are having ongoing meetings to discuss her successor. We would like to post the opening soon and open it up to applications.

**Teacher cultivation** - Initiated with Rayna the idea of sending aspiring teachers to the upcoming Course Leader Training. Cultivating new teachers is a *high priority* for our Center as our teaching corps is aging, some have withdrawn from teaching and other moved. We may be sending 4-6 people to the training.

**Center Relocation** - Bettina and I met to initiate steps. We will be gathering a small group who served as key leaders/support for the last relocation effort. Bettina will host at her home; our hope is some of these folks will step into leadership again with this effort, and to gather information/insights from the prior efforts and to rouse some enthusiasm.

Bettina and I also plan to incorporate a "Members and Friends Center Relocation Town Hall" as part of Harvest of Peace. We will design a structure that will be the first step in visioning, addressing concerns, identifying needs and finding volunteers.

**Finance/HR** - I've asked Jack to research setting up a Health Savings Plan account for Center employees. This can be done through Key Bank without any fees. This would offer employees the ability to put money which would not be taxed into the account for medical and health care costs.

Jack and I are monitoring costs associated with 'Graceful Exits' program Jack generated a spreadsheet with projections which has been forwarded to Council. We opened registration a few days ago and currently have \$1400.00 in sales.

Jack and I will meet set up meetings related to the new Honoria suggestions sent by SI, and to begin the Budget planning process for 2016.

**Calendar Group** - we had our first meeting and have laid out the bones of the 2016 Calendar. This year we have invited people from various parts of the mandala (i.e. arts, Kasung etc) to send us dates for practice, social events and programs. The Teachers Corps was actively involved with this process in terms of curriculum planning, availability etc.

**Membership** - in addition to the Town Hall, the Membership Team is planning a Member's and Friends appreciation event on Halloween (costumes relating to Meek, Perky etc). This will be social not business just as we did last year.

We continue to grow! We appear to be holding steady at 130 which has also resulted in a growth in our dues revenue.

**Other -** Cultivating the Path of Protection was well attended and participants connected well. Hopefully this program will spark new interest in the path of Kasungship.

Jason and I met and have created a schedule and plan for Harvest of Peace. My vision is to enrich it more this year and try to heighten the generosity practice aspect of it as one of our main fundraisers; as well as the community aspect and initiation of the relocation process.

### Practice & Study

Shambhala Training Level II: July 24-26, 16 participants.

<u>Learn to Meditate Workshop:</u> August 1, 22 participants.

<u>Cultivating the Path of Protection:</u> August 8-9, 15 participants.

*Teachers Meeting:* Aug. 5. Shastri Rayna Jacobson, Doug McCanne, Jay Stewart, David Parker, and Michaela were present.

Rayna lead discussions on developing Course Leaders, as a way in part to build a stronger teacher cohort, mentoring people who give talks at various events who are not trained teachers, and SI's announcement that Shastris and senior teachers will begin being able to give instruction on Shambhala Meditation at certain events. Rayna and Doug appear to be our only teachers who are currently included in that.

We also discussed, in light of having a small and decreasing number of teachers, the need to teach maybe all of our classes solo, as opposed to co-teaching, the viability of conducting more online courses possibly facilitated by Course Leaders, using more out-of-town teachers, and offering the Basic Goodness classes in a weekend format.

Looking ahead to the 2016 schedule of classes, we reviewed the existing cohorts of students and what classes they are likely ready to take, i.e., Sacred Path and the later IEL classes, and we acknowledged that we are currently on track and in the black with our revenue from classes in light of trying to stretch our traditional 12 month cycle of classes over 18 months.

## Societal Health & Well Being

#### Director (Jason):

I have drafted a proposal for the formation of a Nyida Day planning committee. Please <u>VIEW IT</u> <u>HERE</u> and give me your feedback and let me know if you might be able to join the committee, which would only meet approximately 6-8 times per year to ensure the timely planning of our major community events.

I have taken on coordination of Harvest of Peace and identified several volunteers for the day. Schedule for the event pending a meeting with Center Director. A flyer draft has been made. Multiple volunteers including: Deborah Kuprunas, Jude Cope, Ruth Hampton, Michele Caulkins.

Update on Midsummer's Day 2016: Meeting planned with Kersten Carr from Eugene to discuss. Booking for Silver Falls cannot happen until 9 months before the event. More details to come!

### Queer Dharma (Jason & Michaela):

Approximately 10 in attendance for talk and discussion led by Michaela titled "Spiritual Bypassing." Currently 9 registered for the Queer Dharma weekend retreat - but several more that say they are attending and just have not registered.

Jason and Michaela have spent considerable time promoting the retreat in the last few weeks before the event - Emails, facebook posts, meetup announcements, flyers. Michaela approached Wild Planet Radio who said they would announce the retreat over the air a few times.

#### Family Council (Mark Douglass, Heather Shaw):

We had about three families (four counting my family) RSVP for the picnic but only a couple of us ended up gathering. It would be great to get some momentum going for family events, however. Is there a way to find out how many families with kids (under 18) we have in the sangha? Or is there a way to create a sign-up Google group or something similar to open up communication regarding future gatherings? Jason will pursue.

#### **Young Meditators (Corey):**

YMG met on 7/23, led by Stephen Jensen. We discussed more readings from Jon Kabat-Zinn's "Wherever You Go, There You Are." It was a nice, good sized group.

The group met again on 8/13 for Social Meditation with David Cook. Wasn't able to attend, but sounds like it was a small group (4-5 people) but engaged.

A group of us volunteered at Jean's Place, a transitional housing project for women, on 8/17, cooking dinner for about 40 women there. We were led by Amina Kirby, who does volunteering there regularly. It was a nice experience, and the organization seems to be doing good work.

### **Heart of Recovery (Ruth):**

I just wanted to report that I signed up HofR for a meetup group. :-) We'll see what happens. I put flyers around, but I'm not sure if that's the best way. I think that this new group listing will be a help. We've been doing well and moving along.

#### **Diversity (Michaela):**

Nothing to report.

#### Aging Mandala (Ann, Bill, Nancy):

As you may recall, last Fall the Shambhala Working Group on Aging (with funding from the Shambhala Trust) conducted a survey of Centre Directors, Group Coordinators, Societal Health & Well-Being Directors and other Centre leadership regarding issues that they saw at their Centres related to the growing population of aging Sangha members. We received a good and wide-ranging response from many of you.

We are pleased to finally release a report on the results of the survey:

#### Aging Survey Executive Summary

### Aging Survey Report (the full report)

Our view is not just whether we are delivering needed services and supports, but is based on realizing that we are all engaged in the warriorship of aging. While the results show that basic goodness is alive and well in Shambhala, there are challenges. This survey will hopefully inform planning and offer ideas for meeting these needs.

Overall there are requests for information, education, and structures of service delivery around caring for each other and also on how to overcome obstacles to practice caused by issues of aging. Centres and groups have also come up with a lot of creative ideas which are brought out in the report (organized by subject.)

The survey was more narrative than statistical in nature. We encourage the reading of the report, which contains many heartfelt and moving quotes from the survey responders, inspired to create a culture of kindness.

Hopefully this report will provide a mirror and help to spread ideas and inspiration around the sangha.

This from Bill Kimbro about the Graceful Exit program in collaboration with Tergar: Ann McQueen-Smith of Tergar, Ann Cason, Jean Ellen Herzegh and myself met 8/11. Lisa Stanley was not feeling well and didn't make it but was involved in the items discussed. We will start more detailed planning and meet again 9/4. The program page is up and the registration is open. We hope for around 100 to attend.

### **Community Care (Jason, interim):**

Jason and Michaela are looking into how we might provide for someone in a wheelchair that would like to attend the Queer Dharma retreat. This individual has attended functions at the center before and hopes to be able to walk short distances (including up the stairs with assistance) by the time of the retreat.

#### **Meditation Warriors Book Group (David):**

We had three people show up. I was told there were several people at Sunday Community Practice who wanted to attend, but I guess they left. One person suggested I change the time to 12pm.

Two of the three participants were members (Jude and Ted). The other participant was new to Shambhala. Jude and Ted liked the format and said they are coming back.

I started a Meetup today (8/16/15). I scheduled next meetups for 9/6 and 9/20.
